Experience

As a partner with Simpson Roberts Architecture Interior Design Inc., Chris is presently responsible for the design of the new Environmental Education Centre for the City of Calgary at Ralph Klein Park, and the redevelopment of the historic Somerville Duplex.

Other completed projects include the redevelopment of the Pilkington Building for Critical Mass, the Bobsled/Luge Start Training Facility for Canada Olympic Park, the new head office and manufacturing plant for Smed International, Mogens Smed's private residence and client guest facilities in Priddis, the Stephen Avenue Mall redevelopment, and the North Mount Pleasant Art Centre. In addition, Chris has received awards from the Alberta Association of Architects and Western Living Magazine for the Mullis Residence and a Canadian Architect Award of Excellence for the Mirror Lake Visitors' Centre in Camrose, Alberta.

Chris joined Graham McCourt Architects in 1979. As a senior design architect and associate, he was responsible for the design of a variety of projects including Medicine Hat City Hall, which received a Governor General's Medal for Architecture.

Chris is an Adjunct Professor of Architecture in the Faculty of Environmental Design at the University of Calgary and is currently teaching an advanced class in building science.
